Detail:	In February 1918 Charles was declared unfit
	for war service in France. He was posted back
	to an army labour unit in Britain and allowed
	to work on a farm near his home in Padstow.
	But Spanish Flu, a pandemic that killed millions,
	hit the town in September and both Charles and 6-year-old son Alfred died.
Age at death:	32
Military info:	Like many Charles did no rush to volunteer and by late 1915 conscription
	loomed for those not in protected jobs. But unwilling to introduce compulsion
	the government opted for a compromise - the Derby Scheme. This let men
	aged 18 to 40 enlist voluntarily in the Army Reserve but with an obligation
	to come if called up later. To 'encourage' recruits it was hinted conscription
	would soon to be introduced. Charles enlisted that December. His call up
	came five months later and on 30th May 1916 Charles was posted to the
	Devonshire Regiment. After training he was judged unfit for frontline service
	and 4 months later posted to 13th Devons, a works unit at Plymouth. On 26th
	February 1917 he was sent to 5 th Labour Company in France. The men of the
	Labour Corps were the unsung heroes of the war, a vast army of khaki navvies
	that kept Britain's fighting soldiers in the field and the road to victory well maintained. Charles was with 5th Labour Company until May when he was
	posted to 170th Labour Company. But 6 months later, heath deteriorating, he
	was sent to Plymouth. On 25th Feb 1918 he was posted to 650th Labour
	Company, an agricultural unit, and sent to work near Padstow. But as the war
	ended Spanish Flu struck Britain and Charles and his little son Alfred perished.
Grave/memorial:	Charles is buried at Padstow Cemetery, and is commemorated at St Petroc's
	Church, Padstow on the Padstow War Memorial.
Family info:	<u>Father</u> : Charles Edwards, agricultural labourer, born Egloshayle, Cornwall in
	1855. He married Jane Wareham in 1881 and had two daughters. Jane died in
	1886. <u>Mother:</u> Elizabeth (maiden name unknown), born Padstow, Cornwall
	in 1848. She married Charles soon after his first wife's death and had three
	children. Only two survived. Wife: Charles wed Florence Dunn in August
	1911. They both worked on a farm at Trevose. They had three children.
